Zimbabwe Diplomats assess ivory stockpile in Zimbabwe and discuss conservation

The Zimbabwe Parks Management Authority (ZimParks) recently opened its closely guarded vaults containing 151'000 tonnes of ivory and rhino horn to a team of Western diplomats led by the Ambassador of Switzerland, Mr. Niculin Jäger.

Zimbabwe's estimated 70,000 elephants are over the carrying capacity of its national parks. There has been increased human-wildlife conflict in national parks that are close to human settlement.

The ZimParks director-general, Fulton Mangwanya said a "one-off sale" of the collection, taken from smugglers and poachers, and harvested from carcasses found in the country's national parks, could raise US\$600 million, and the proceeds go towards wildlife management.



The sale of ivory has been banned since 1989 by Cites, the international body that monitors endangered species.

"Conservation and prevention of illegal wildlife trade is an international issue because of the involvement of criminal syndicates in illegal wildlife trade, hence there is a need to strengthen international cooperation," said Ambassador Jäger.

On behalf of the delegation, Ambassador Jäger said Zimbabwe has a rich bio-diversity and the delegation was keen to continue providing support towards the conservation of the endangered animals.
