### Swiss Fondue in Africa – Growing Up in a Country at War

Simone Sievi's memoir, Swiss Fondue in Africa – Growing Up in a Country at War, is a vivid, heartfelt account of growing up in Southern Rhodesia during a time of political upheaval and social transformation.

Born the youngest of four daughters to Swiss parents, Simone's life began on African soil, yet always shadowed by European traditions. Her father's deep love for African

wildlife and flora shaped her own bond with the wilderness from a young age. She recalls a barefoot childhood, full of freedom, curiosity, and a quiet tension between belonging and displacement. Though she carried Swiss blood, she considered herself a white African—a label that brought both pride and complication. Her early years were shaped by the contrast of cultures: British colonial snobbery versus Swiss egalitarianism.

While her peers ate marmite sandwiches at school, her lunch comprised pungent Swiss cheeses. She was immersed in African nature but raised in a home where the adults spoke a language she did not understand.

#### A Nation at the Brink

As the country descended into guerrilla warfare, Simone's family chose to stay-a decision that would irreversibly shape their future. The war, framed by the broader Cold War, pitted Rhodesians against Russianand Chinese-backed forces. Violence, fear, and uncertainty became part of daily life. Simone's youthful optimism was challenged by the very real dangers surrounding her. Her memoir captures these moments not through political analysis, but through the honest lens of a child trying to make sense of chaos. She brings to life the emotional complexity of growing up amid conflict-with humour, raw honesty, and even satire. The narrative asks readers: who truly

owns the land we live on, and what does belonging mean?

#### **Dreams Redirected**

From an early age, Simone aspired to become a doctor, driven by compassion and a love for healing. But financial limitations stood in her way, and her parents chose another path for her. She studied Pharmacy at the University of Zimbabwe, where she was the only white student in her class. This experience deepened her understanding of race, community, and the social inequalities around her. After graduation, she chose to serve in rural hospitals, where she provided medical care to black patients with humility and empathy. Her story is not one of attachment to

privilege, but of service offered freely, and with heart.

#### Love, Loss, and Legacy

Simone met her husband in Zimbabwe and later joined him in running a tourism business in South Africa's Drakensberg Mountains. Together, they built a life-and a livelihood-around their shared love for the land, had two children, and bred a small herd of Jersey cows for milk to make cheese. They still manage their lodge, a restaurant and cheesery, a tour company, and a craft shop. Simone, a self-taught ceramic artist, also runs a Paint on Clay workshop and sells her art across South Africa. Her ceramic pieces and paintings, often inspired by animals and landscapes, echo her deep connection to the African wilderness. She splits her time between the Drakensberg and a private nature reserve in Hoedspruit, where she writes and creates in solitude.

#### The Brutal Cost of Belonging

In 2001, Simone's parents became victims of politically motivated violence in Zimbabwe. They were attacked by young men claiming to be war veterans—a consequence of Mugabe's incitement against white citizens. Simone and her family cared for her parents during their final years in South Africa,

far from the Swiss Alps but safe and loved. This tragedy, though deeply personal, is framed within a wider reflection on racism, propaganda, and political manipulation. She bears witness to what happens when a government fuels hatred and suppresses truth.

#### A Voice from the Margins

Throughout Swiss Fondue in Africa, Simone Sievi addresses uncomfortable truths. As a Catholic, she reflects on harmful practices within the Church—especially toward children-topics that remain painfully relevant today. She challenges the reader to reconsider inherited prejudices and blind loyalty to power. Her perspective is shaped by living under dictatorship, where propaganda drowned out citizens' voices and human rights eroded over time. Her writing is as much a political testimony as it is a personal memoir. She speaks with the voice of someone who has seen both sides of freedom-and who understands its price.

#### **Moments of Humour and Humanity**

Despite the darkness, the book sparkles with anecdotes that bring laughter and warmth. There are holidays crammed into a family car with six females and one beleaguered father. There's the absurdity of highbrow Swiss Embassy luncheons amidst African turmoil. She remembers Christmas trees lit with real candles in the summer heat, and silver tinsel mailed from Switzerland. There's the memory of sleeping under the stars at Lake Kariba, and even catching crocodiles from a boat at midnight. Driving lessons with her Shona aunt facilitate cultural exchanges filled with laughter and learning.

#### A Memoir for Our Time

Simone Sievi's book is more than a personal history—it's a mirror held

up to our world today. Her reflections on xenophobia, dictatorship, cultural identity, and resilience resonate far beyond Africa. In an age when autocracy and inequality are on the rise again, her voice feels urgent and necessary. She reminds us of the value of empathy, the power of truth, and the importance of never taking peace for granted. Through her story, readers are invited to walk barefoot through Africa's beauty and sorrow, and come away changed. Swiss Fondue in Africa – Growing Up in a Country at War is not only Simone Sievi's story—it is a voice for every ordinary person caught in the extraordinary machinery of history.

## Swiss-South African Scientific Cooperation shows strong results

The 7th Swiss-South African Joint Committee meeting on Scientific and Technological Cooperation took place in Bern in March 2025. The session, opened by SERI head Martina Hirayama and South African Ambassador Sello Moloto, reviewed successful ongoing collaborations and explored new opportunities.

Since the bilateral agreement was signed in 2007, both countries have built strong ties through institutions like SERI, SNSF, and South Africa's NRF. The Swiss Leading House for Africa, operated by the Swiss Tropical and Public Health Institute and University of Basel, will continue to launch joint project calls during the 2025–2028 ERI period.

Over 120 projects have been funded since 1962 through Swiss Government Excellence Scholarships, and the 2008 bilateral programme has supported long-term collaboration. A key milestone was the 2021 SNSF-NRF lead agency agreement, renewed in 2023, which has since funded 16 joint projects. A notable example includes the Bilateral Research Chair in Blockchain Technology.
