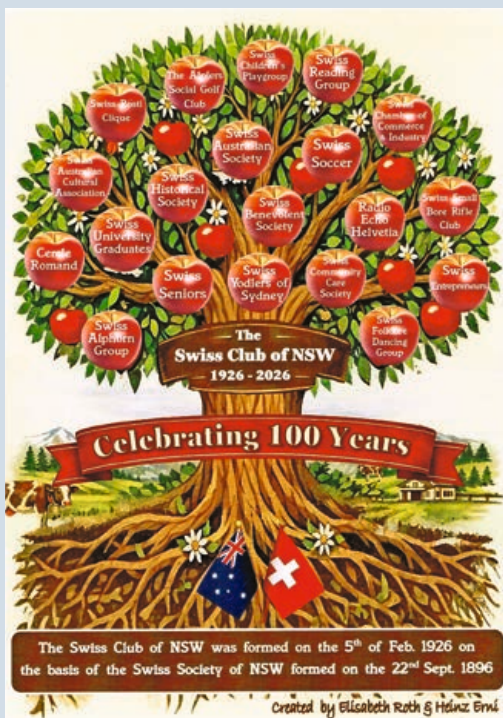

100 Years Swiss Club of New South Wales 1926 – 2026



What had existed as a benevolent society started by a few Swiss migrants in Sydney in 1898 to assist other newly arrived compatriots became the Swiss Club of New South Wales, with still the same objectives of support, but from then on also offering more social activities and keeping Helvetic culture alive. Exactly to the day, 5th February 2026, 100 years later, around 150 Club members and guests gathered at the historic Parliament House of NSW in Macquarie Street, Sydney.

What a celebration! Parliament House had not seen so many Swiss flags and balloons in a long time!

In the main room, free-standing round tables covered in vibrant red over

white, shiny balloon bouquets, impeccably folded napkins, bowls filled with Lindor double chocolate balls, along the walls displays of historic photos and in the back, a table with valuable original archive Club documents. Of special interest were the posters of a huge tree growing from underground roots decorated with the Swiss and the Australian flags, blossoming into a wide canopy covered with red apples, each one showing the name of the various local Swiss community groups. William Tell would have been very proud.

The Hon. Greg Piper MP, Speaker of the NSW Legislative Assembly, and Mark Hodges MP, Member for Castle Hill, representing an official State presence, joined and addressed the gathering, warmly welcoming all visitors to the Parliament House, which still incorporates the façade of the original Rum Hospital built in 1816.

He was everywhere – Swiss Club President Daniel Frutiger, calm and fully in charge, coordinating speakers and caterers, making sure everything went smoothly, a friendly word or smile for everybody, and always assisted by his lovely wife Maria. After having joined the Club as a member, he became part of the committee in 2004 and was elected President in 2010.

Daniel and his dedicated team have been keeping the Club very much alive, fun and exciting, with quite a steady membership over all the years, and without forgetting many good old Swiss traditions. During his speech, he made it clear that the Swiss Club was looking forward to sustaining Swiss culture and traditions for generations to come. This 100th birthday celebration of the Club's rich history was certainly an absolute and well-deserved highlight for him during the 16 years of his presidency.

After all the meet and greet, handshakes, the mingling and the hugs when finding old friends, and having a



welcome drink (or two), it was time for the speeches.

Consul General of Switzerland Elisabeth Boesch-Malinen had delayed her departure to Canberra for a meeting at the Embassy of Switzerland to congratulate the Swiss Club of NSW in the name of Switzerland. Beat Knoblauch, one of the four Australian delegates to the Council of the Swiss Abroad, read out a congratulatory message sent by the Swiss Alliance Australia SAA, the umbrella organisation of Swiss Associations in Australia.

The formal part of the celebrations over, it was past lunch time, and trays after trays of freshly prepared delicious finger food were passed continuously around the room. Of course, you had to have a souvenir of this historic occasion. Much in demand were the specially designed 100th Anniversary T-shirts and elegant ballpoint pen from the Swiss brand Caran d'Ache, only produced in a very limited edition.

Swiss Club webmaster, the dedicated Martin Frutiger with his wizard's digital skills, had compiled a huge selection of photos of activities, personalities and groups over the years, all showing non-stop on a huge screen and often causing shrieks of laughter, mock-shocked expressions on some faces or bringing back lovely memories of many unforgettable moments experienced with the Swiss Club over the years.

As closing time approached, swinging from left to right and arm in arm with each other, a happy group spontaneously started singing some popular Swiss-German songs. By 16.12hrs, the red and white balloons had

been collected and some could be seen floating down Macquarie Street, and flags and displays were rolled up.

Everybody united on this 5th February 2026 was here to celebrate our connection with our adopted home country of Australia and to wish OUR Swiss Club of NSW a very happy 100th birthday – Long Live the Swiss Club of NSW!

This project began with a simple idea: let's really see each other.

Led by Patrick Rychner, the 100 x Swissness Arts Project set out to photograph 100 members of the Swiss Club of Victoria (SCV) – not just as faces, but as people with stories, histories, and quirks worth sharing. The aim was connection. Members meeting members. Old hands crossing paths with newer faces. Conversations starting where they might not have before.

That matters, especially in a club where many long-time members are aging and many newer ones are second-generation Swiss who don't yet know the people who built this place. A portrait, it turns out, is a good excuse to stop, look, and ask a question.

Each participant brought one object to their photo session – something Swiss, something personal, or something that simply says, 'this is me'. These small details do a lot of the talking. They spark stories, memories, and the kind of exchanges that keep a community alive.

Shot in a consistent studio style, the portraits form a growing body of work – part exhibition, part archive, part family album. Together, they capture a snapshot of Swiss life in Australia.

The vernissage of this exhibition was part of Open House, celebrating the 127th anniversary of the foundation of the SCV.

NSW: Swiss Community Care Society (SCCS NSW)

Are you aware that the Swiss Club of NSW and Swiss Community Care Society (SCCS NSW) are two separate organisations? Sometimes people think if you're a member of one, you're automatically a member of the other. However, that is not the case. Members of SCCS receive the Swiss Club Magazine as a bonus, which might be the cause of the confusion. The Swiss Community Care Society, founded in 1970, was originally called Swiss Benevolent Society. Its aim was and still is to support Swiss people in difficult situations. These Swiss could be ill, have a social problem or be financially stressed due to unforeseen circumstances like floods or bushfires. SCCS tries to assist compatriots of any age and actually did that some time ago, when it helped a young Swiss woman financially (after careful investigation of her situation) with an urgently needed operation.

As such cases are relatively rare, the elderly have become the target of our attention. SCCS is trying to minimise loneliness, a general problem in our society. We send out birthday cards, and volunteers distribute Christmas presents to those who turn 80 or above. SCCS also organises outings. As they usually take place on a weekday, the elderly Swiss are better able to attend, but all age groups are welcome. The events are financially subsidised by about 50% for members and are much loved get-togethers. Whether someone is new to the area, living alone, going through a challenging time or just missing a sense of Swiss community, SCCS is for you. If you are a younger person you might like to join and enjoy being a volunteer visitor.

We warmly encourage you to consider becoming a member of both organisations. Both clubs bring us together socially – but Swiss Community Care Society tries even harder to make the elderly feel that they have not been forgotten by their fellow Swiss in NSW.

The large contingency of newly elected delegates resulted in a record number of submissions made, many with the aim to improve the workings of the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad (OSA). The Council welcomed the Parliament's decision to scrap most of the cuts planned as part of the federal government's austerity package that would have affected Swiss citizens living abroad. This applies not only to the OSA, but also to SWI swissinfo.ch and the Swiss schools abroad.

On Thursday the delegates had the opportunity to meet with members of the Swiss Government at the Federal Parliament. The panel discussion about the new treaties between Switzerland and the EU and the popular initiative 'No to a Switzerland of 10 million!' took centre stage. More here ➔
